

**Learning by doing:** Students connect theory & knowledge



- 2.5 yr commitment to collaboratively manage \$10 million
- Access to mentors, workshops, and summer internship
- 7-9 students selected per year, typically during Year 2
- Class of 2026 will be admitted in January 2024

#### UBC SWIFT: Sauder Women+ in Finance Training

- 1 yr rolling commitment to train a more inclusive pipeline of talent
- Access to mentors, workshops, and summer internship
- 8-10 students selected per year, from Years 1, 2, or 3
