COMM 498 INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS

All students must take one of COMM 483, 486M, 491, 497 or 498. IB students take COMM 498. COMM 498 does not count as an international studies requirement.

INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

You cannot go to your home country for your international experience unless you have lived outside that country since at least the fall of grade 8. List the countries in which you have lived from grade 7 to current (domestic & international). Your international experience must be a minimum 5 weeks in duration and include a minimum of 6 credits earned.

- The IB option is not competitive but a minimum GPA is required for exchange.
