

No Summer Internship? No Problem.

You can do things other than an internship.

If a full-time, career-related summer internship doesn't work out, you can still build relevant experience by combining seasonal or part-time work, certifications, and independent or project-based learning.

Alternatives to Internships:

1. Build experience through a seasonal or part-time job: Example of job boards for seasonal/summer roles

3. Network through events, LinkedIn/Ten Thousand Coffees, or informational interviews.

A. <u>FORAGE</u>: Internships, jobs, exclusive events, and free, self-paced simulations created by top global companies

- Eligibility: Open to everyone, including international students

B. <u>Riipen</u>: Project-based internships in areas such as digital marketing, product management, UX/UI, learning design, software development, and IT (80 hours over 2–8 weeks).

• Eligibility: open to Canadian citizens, Permanent Residents, or persons to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act.

7. Volunteer: Apply for volunteering experiences through non-profit websites or browse volunteer opportunities on <u>Charity Village</u>.
